Children are educated about current events across the world and encouraged to observe all significant days in the calendar.

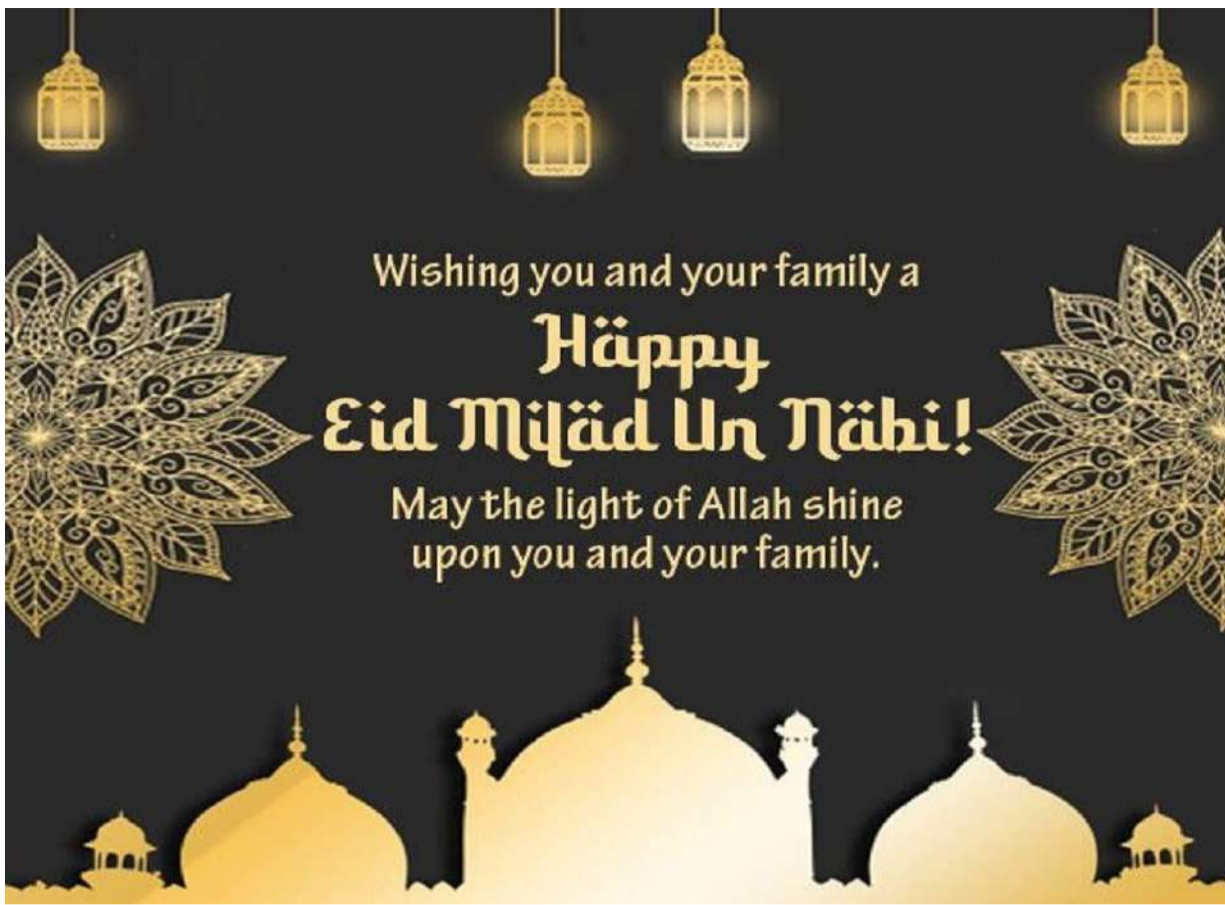
Hindi Divas:
